Membership

- The Committee will consist of up to a maximum 12 members
- Membership will include representation from men and women and academic and professional staff at different career stages and from different disciplines
- Membership to the committee will be on an annual basis upon which people can opt out of their commitment or ask to serve an extra term
- The Committee Chair will be selected annually by the Bio21 Director/ Deputy Director

Meeting Chair

- Meetings will be chaired by the Committee Chair
- The Committee Chair will arrange meetings with Director and Deputy Director of the Bio21 Institute as the year commences to discuss objectives and financial support for the year
- Liaise with Bio21 administrative staff to publish and promote the yearly agenda as well as upcoming events and initiatives

Terms of Reference

- develop and monitor strategies to support women (researchers and professional staff) in the Institute
- promote awareness of Equal Opportunity policies and issues within the Institute
- plan events to celebrate the Women of Bio21 and their achievements
